- 3. Approval of minutes of the 17th Session of the Presidium
 The minutes of the 17th Presidium Meeting of ISM were approved.
- 4. Discussion of the Agenda for the 18th Session of the Presidium

The agenda was amended to include discussion on the Secretariat.

5. Report on activities with UNESCO

Mr. Bordonne reported on the success ISM is enjoying with UNESCO. The application has been received and processed by the administrative branch of UNESCO. It has not been processed by the technical branch. An additional request for information has been forwarded. The Secretary-General has been invited to this meeting and the Congress.

He suggested that Mr. Hart write the UNESCO Secretary-General stating firmly that all delegates from South Africa are complying with UNESCO's policies on Apartheid. Mr. Hart and Mr. Navitniy will continue to work with Mr. Bordonne on the application. They will be prepared to report to UNESCO the ISM activities on environmental concerns.

6. Reports from individual countries, calendar of meetings

Delegates reported on major mine surveying activities in their individual countries. See calendar at the end of these minutes for dates of important meetings for mine surveyors.

7. Secretariat

Mr. Kunak, the incoming president, outlined what the secretariat should do and why the position is important to ISM. He can appoint a secretariat during his administration (Statutes). Approval by Category "B" by UNESCO is important for this position to work.

8. Other business

Mr. Kirvessemi, Secretary-General for FIG reported on cooperation between FIG and ISM. He distributed FIG position papers.

Mr. Hart reported that he had received written reports from all the commission chairmen: Meixner, Palm, Czubik, Peilok, Luxa. He recognized the importance of these commissions. He stated that Mr. Luxa has retired. A new chairman will be appointed for this position. Mr. Hart agreed to meet with each commission on Wednesday.

The president thanked the translators for their assistance in enhancing communications for this Presidium meeting.
